Grading System

Belmont High School operates on a modified 4x4 block scheduling system. The student handbook and program of studies are available on our website: www.bhs.sau80.org Our GPA and class rank are based on all academic credit courses completed, with a final value calculated upon completion of all high school coursework. A grade of “U” is assigned when a student fails a course – an automatic 59% is calculated in for averaging purposes. All diploma seeking students are ranked. All **AP, Honors and Running Start (dual enrollment) courses** are weighted with a multiplier of 1.05. All other courses are considered **college prep** and receive their actual numerical value in the GPA calculation.
